My Bondage Bamboo Backpack whats inside and how does it work



What's it all about

I don't know about you - but I'm kinda picky about backpacks. I always try to find one that can fit as much stuff as possible in as tiny a space as possible. At the same time I want to be able to access every piece quite fast, without removing all the other stuff. For BDSM, and especially for bondage munches, I used to put my stuff in a normal suitcase. That way I could carry a lot, organise everything neatly and access every piece quickly.

The big problem was that I couldn't put all things in the case that I wanted to. There was no space for a blanket, bamboo cane or water bottle, so I had to carry them in an additional backpack. To simply use a backpack didn't solve my problems either, as they all tend to have an accessibility problem.

So I set out to build a nice looking backpack with a bit of a bondage theme, which would be able to carry everything I need in an organised an easily accessible manner. And I was successful! Meet the Bondage Bamboo Backpack - It will turn your world upside down!

The Bondage Bamboo

This is the bondage bamboo backpack that I created. Inside it you will find everything that I, and most other riggers, need for a bondage session. You can easily carry it with you because of the strap which is attached to the bamboo cane. All the features have a purpose and I think you will be surprised by all the things you can find in this selfmade backpack. In the following I will explain all the little details.





Rain Protection Cape

Bamboo is sadly a very fragile material when it comes to temperature and air humidity. That's why I decided to sew a nice-looking, and easily attachable water protection tube for it. The waterproof fabric is normally used for umbrellas. When needed, just slide the bamboo backpack inside the protection tube, slip over the covering hood and fixate it.

The protection tube has an additional carrying-strap, so you can still transport it very easily.





Remove the first Layer

Now let's get started. After you arrived at your destination just remove the carrying strap and the strap that holds the blanket. This will only take you ten seconds.

At the same time these strips are also climbing slings that can hold up to 200-300 kg each. Those can be used to construct suspension points for your bamboo cane. So if you have hooks on the ceiling, a T-bar or anything else and you can't attach the bamboo directly to it or want to adjust the height, just use the straps.

The blanket can be used to soften the ground and create a clean and cuddly space. It also makes for a nice border and shows people that this is your space.






Suspend the Bamboo

After removing everything and attaching the bamboo to the ceiling / suspension point, it should look like this:

Note: The blanket is twice as big as in the picture.

If you want to suspend the bamboo without using the straps, you can just use the carabiners attached to the bamboo.





Remove the caps

The main point of my bamboo backpack is being able to carry all your stuff inside your suspension point. Your things will be hidden under the two separate caps that seal the bamboo cane on both ends. They are attached with two Velcro strips which are covered on the outside to look like jute rope. After removing the caps, you have two little bowls for your and your bunny's (model's) stuff that you don't need or shouldn't wear while tying (rings etc.).







Get your rope

On the right side of the bamboo you can find the ropes. I constructed it this way so you can simply slide them out and back in. There is enough room for 14×8 m ropes + 2×4 m ropes.





Suspend your rope buttler

After removing the "Rope-Butler", you can hang it on your bamboo and adjust the height to your needs. Or just lay it on the ground or attach it to whatever you want...

The whole thing is covered with a bondage scarf, which can be used as a blindfold or head support for suspension.

After you removed the blindfold, just detach the 4 m jute rope that holds the butler together and tightens the rope coils.

The butler is constructed in a way that makes it easy to handle the ropes with one hand.

That means you don't have to put your ropes on the (maybe unclean) ground or risk getting them wet. Speaking from personal experience: If you do self-suspensions, you will appreciate the butler a lot because it let's you reach your ropes quite easily even when you are tied up.





Hidden whip

Hidden under the rope butler is a little "whip" that I used to carry with me. It's not that painful, but also not harmless if you know how to use it. During my bondage session I like to have the possibility to use this if the rope bunny (model) and I feel like it. It cannot be discovered if you haven't used any rope yet, so the rope bunny may not know it's there - which makes for a nice surprise.







Supply box

Without a doubt many riggers carry more than just rope. I personally like to bring little things like gags and cuffs with me and use them in my bondage session or maybe afterwards.

For that purpose, I built a nice little supply box which fits inside the bamboo perfectly and can be removed very fast and easily.





Whats inside the supply box

I worked long on this little supply box. I used my 3D printer to fit it perfectly into my bamboo cane. I also put in two separators for some internal organisation.


It was important to me that the supply box provides me fast with the stuff I want, doesn't look crappy and fits the whole "scenario". There are little ropes on the side for pulling the box out of the bamboo.





Content

- ball gag
- 2 x suspension-rings
- 2 x chains
- 8 x security locks
- blindfold
- 2 x leather cuffs
- foam tape
- security scissors
- climbing sling



Water bottle

It's always a good idea to bring your own water bottle with you. While doing bondage you should drink a lot.

This bottle can hold 1,5 l and has a bamboo case matching the style of the backpack.








Optional suspend points

If you want to tie something where you need some fix points on the bamboo, you can use these little rings and attach them with the climbing sling.

They are moveable if you attach them on the inside. Attached on outside, they are fixed and can be used as hard points.





Optional Bamboo

If you want to, you can carry up to six additional bamboo sticks with you and it doesn't affect the backpack. Just slide them under the blanket which is wrapped around the bamboo and you're ready to go.

I often use a second bamboo cane as a second suspension point which I attach to my main bamboo.
